# NRLN Action Alert - Don't Allow Funding Cut to Medicare Home Healthcare

Medicare plans a 9.36% cut to its home healthcare program in 2024, on top of the 3.9% cut that began in 2023. An NRLN Action Alert issue on January 15 asked NRLN members to urge their members Congress to pass **H.R.5159/S.2137**, **Preserving Access to Home Health Act**, which would help preserve access to home health services for seniors and Americans with disabilities by preventing the proposed cuts.

## NRLN Action Alert - Include HCTC in Tax Legislation

For several years Congress passed year-to-year legislation to reauthorize the Health Coverage Tax Credit (HCTC) Act. However, HCTC was not extended in 2022 and 2023 to help Americans ages 55-64 cover the cost of health insurance if they are retired and their pensions have been taken over by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation, or if their job was outsourced abroad and they qualify for Trade Adjustment Assistance.

Th NRLN was alerted on January 9 that Congressional tax writers were working on a bipartisan tax deal and negotiations are expected to be finalized within the week. This presented an opportunity to include in the legislation **H.R.2914**, **Health Coverage Tax Credit Reauthorization Act of 2023**, which would reauthorize HCTC for five years.

An NRLN issued an Action Alert was issued on January asking NRLN members to immediately send the NRLN's sample letter to their U.S. Representative who is a member of the House Committee on Ways and Means to request that HCTC be included in tax legislation. HCTC is very important to many NRLN members and other seniors because it will help those ages 55-64 cover a large part of their health insurance costs.

#### NRLN Legislative Committees' Work

The NRLN's Legislative Advisory Committee (LAC) composed of Judy Stenberg, Chairwoman, Deb Morrissett, Joe Mazzei and Al Duscher prioritizes retirement-related bills it will review during its twice-a-month conference calls. The LAC submitted the following bills for the Legislative Action Priorities Committee (LAPC) to consider for action.

The LAPC, which includes Bill Kadereit, Chairman, Judy Stenberg, Alyson Parker, Martha Deahl and Ed Beltram, took the actions below on the bills during its January 8 conference call.

The work of the LAC and the LAPC provides the cornerstone for much of the dealings with members of Congress and their staff members.

## H.R.4104/S.1976, Preserving Patient Access to Home Infusion

**Act**, would protect access to Medicare's home infusion benefit by making clear that pharmacy services for home infusion therapy can be reimbursed and sets an appropriate rate for such services. It will save the Medicare program millions of dollars, cut patient costs, and ensure seniors receive safe and adequate care in the comfort of their own home. Specifically, the legislation would:

- include pharmacy services as part of covered home infusion therapy under Medicare, encompassing assessments, drug preparation and compounding, and care coordination and documentation;
- direct CMS to pay 50% of the nursing rate on home infusion days when a nurse is not present;
- allow nurse practitioners and physician assistants to establish and review the plan of care for home infusion therapy.

-- On January 9, 2024, NRLN President Bill Kadereit sent letters to Committee on Finance Chairman Ron Wyden (OR) and Ranking Member Mike Crapo (ID) requesting a Committee vote on **S.1976**.

**H.R.4408/S.1906, Promising Pathway Act**, would help Americans with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) and other life-threatening diseases such as Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma (DIPG) get early access to promising treatments. It would expedite beneficial outcomes for patients by requiring the FDA to establish a rolling, real-time, priority review pathway for drugs intended to treat, prevent, or diagnose serious or life-threatening diseases or conditions.

The LAC tabled and is monitoring the following bill:

**H.R.5338, No Discrimination in my Benefits Act,** is intended to ensure that investment managers stay focused solely on providing maximized returns for retirement savers, rather than focusing on diversity, equity, and inclusion metrics.
